Additionally, Heidegger's confrontation with Aristotle's Greek text makes a significant contribution to contemporary scholarship on Aristotle, particularly the understanding of potentiality in Aristotle's thought. Finally, the book exemplifies Heidegger's gift for teaching students how to read a philosophical text and how to question that text in a philosophical way.

Whitehead's Categoreal Scheme and Other Papers Jul 30 2019 The philosophical papers comprising this volume range from process metaphysics and theology, through the phenomenological study of intentionality, to the foundations of geometry and of the system of real

numbers. New light, it is thought, is shed on all these topics, some of them being of the highest interest and under intensive investigation in contemporary philosophical discussion. Metaphysicians, process theologians, semanticists, theorists of knowledge, phenomenologists, and philosophers of mathematics will thus find in this book, it is hoped, helpful materials and methods. A detailed examination of some aspects of Hartshorne's recent *Creative Synthesis and Philosophic Method* is given in II. This book is perhaps the most significant work on process philosophy since *Process and Reality* itself, and its logical underpinnings thus merit a full critical discussion.
