New Approaches to the Temple of Zeus at Olympia Feb 13 2021 This volume brings together the proceedings of an international and interdisciplinary symposium held at Budapest between 8th and 10th May 2014. It was the first event dealing exclusively

Recommendations made throughout the report are also listed at the end. Appendices include excerpts from relevant legislation.
